

FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS IN SEATTLE, WA DID YOUR TESTS YIELD VALID RESULTS?

If a police officer suspects a person of driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, many times they will request the driver to perform a field sobriety test. Field sobriety tests were developed by law enforcement officials to help officers make roadside determinations about whether or not a driver is impaired. As the test is performed, the police officer will evaluate the driver's reactions and performance of the requested tasks taking note of behaviors that may indicate impairment. If a person performs poorly during a field sobriety test, this may give the officer probable cause to make an arrest for DUI.

The accuracy of field sobriety tests has been a widely contested issue throughout the Seattle area because many of these tests are designed to facilitate failure on the part of the test subject. Many sober people have trouble performing field sobriety tests and as a result many attorneys believe the results of these tests should not be considered as evidence to incriminate a person of DUI.
